THAT WE Mary Melty John S. Keech of York
Township and William S. Keech of Windsor
Township all of York County

are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the sum of Five Thousand
(2000.) Dollars, to be paid to the said Commonwealth, to which payment well and
truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, jointly and severally, for and in the whole, our heirs, execu-
tors, and administrators, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, dated the Twenty Sixth
day of August in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and seventy two

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS, That if the above bounden Mary
Melty of Windsor Township Administratrix of all and
singular the goods, chattels and credits of Samuel Melty late of
Jasper County Virginia deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and
perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall
come to the hands, possession or knowledge of her the said Mary Melty
or into the hands and possession of any other
person or persons for her and the same so made, to exhibit or cause to be exhibited into
the Register's Office in the County of York, within thirty days from the date hereof, and the same goods,
chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of her
death, which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said Mary
Melty or into the hands and possession of any other person or
persons for her do well and truly administer according to law. And further do make
or cause to be made, a true and just account of her said administration, within one year
from the date hereof, or when thereunto legally required, and all the rest and residue of the said goods,
chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administration account, the same
being first examined and allowed by the Orphans' Court of the County having jurisdiction, shall deliver and
pay unto such person or persons as the said Orphans' Court by their decree or sentence, pursuant to law,
shall limit and appoint, and shall well and truly comply with the laws of this commonwealth relating to col-
lateral inheritances; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the said
deceased, and the same shall be proved according to law, if the said Mary Melty
being thereunto required do surrender the said letters of
administration into the Register's Office aforesaid, then this obligation be void, otherwise to remain in full
force.
